




Did you know

It is less complicated to remove wisdom teeth when the patient is younger because:



The roots are not completely formed.



Surrounding bone is softer.



When should they be removed?

Damage to

adjacent teeth


Generally, wisdom teeth should be surgically removed when there are:

Infections and/or periodontal (gum) disease

Damaged neighboring teeth

What is an impacted tooth?

When wisdom teeth cannot break through the gums, or there isn't enough room for them.



Formation of cysts

Infection



What if they are not removed?

Healthy, properly positioned wisdom teeth require:

Regular, professional cleanings

Annual checkups

Periodic X-rays to monitor for changes

25 Years



There is less chance of damaging nearby nerves or other structures.





Cavities that can't be restored

Cysts, tumors or other pathologies



Pain-free does not necessarily mean disease-free. The worst thing to do is to ignore your wisdom teeth.
